



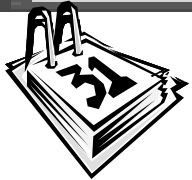

May Program

Last month program was given by Norm Koerner and Clay Crocker on Tool Sharpening. Norm started the program showing us many different tools explaining there uses with a little history of each tool. He then explained the different tools/ machines used to sharpen These tools (bench grinder, files, stones.

He then turned it over to Clay who

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provided us with details on the sharpening of chisels and plane irons. The steps for shaping a chisel are: Flatten the face

Grind the bevel

Hone the cutting edge

These steps should be done for all new chisels, after these steps you only need to hone for future sharpening.

Clay then discussed the different types of hand sharpening abrasives; stones - oil, water, and diamond; sheet abrasives - silicon carbide and aluminum oxide, and loose grit. He then explained the different types of honing guides and their uses.

The program was a good refresher on the proper steps in sharpening tools.
