



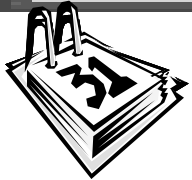

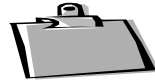

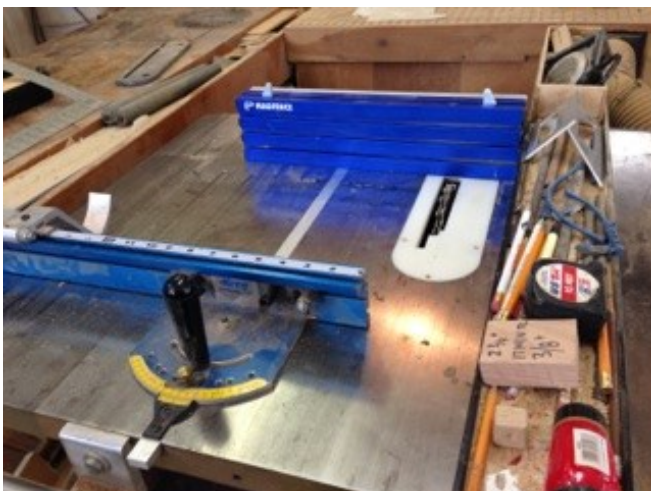

He was one of six people awarded the 2015 Order of Lincoln Award by Governor Rauner this month for "helping to make Illinois and the world a better place." Roland was surgeon and founding chairman of the Department of Surgery at the Southern Illinois University School of Medicine. He also served on the SIU-School of Medicine's faculty for more than 30 years, and the Folse Endowed Chair of Surgery has been established in his honor. Norm Koerner's Open Shop

Despite the snow and cold, we still had several members show up at Norm's shop for some great muffins made by his wife and a tour by Norm of his shop.



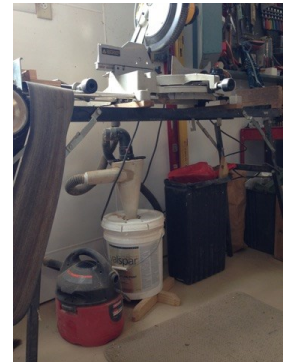
Norm presented some of the unique tools he has and uses in this shop such as these magnetic fences for his table saw and this Craftsman shaper/molder blade set.

Norm's Open Shop—cont.

He gave us a tour through the more unusual tools in his tool cabinet such as these wrenches in the middle photos.



We discussed some of the more unusual aspects of the dust collection systems he uses in his shop such as the use of cups to shut off segments of his piping and home-made cyclone chip collector under his miter saw (far right).



He also demonstrated a switch unit he bought at Sears that simultaneously starts the vacuum connected to his miter saw at the same time he starts the saw and delays the stopping of the vacuum a few seconds after the saw stops. I believe the unit only cost about \$12 or something like that. It also has additional outlets to support the operation of a light or other accessories as needed.

We discussed his latest tool acquisition, a Powermatic lathe and some of the unfinished projects (below) he has been working on.



One of the more interesting tools he had in his shop was this old drill press (photo far right) acquired by his father with a stand they fashioned out of a man-hole cover. Where the man-hole cover came from remains a mystery.

The entire tour and discussion was really very interesting. I know everyone who braved the snow to attend the open shop event thought it was worthwhile and enjoyed the visit. His wife's muffins were worth the trip alone. Thank you Karen!
