



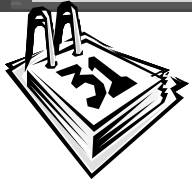

October 13 Field Trip Overview: Monday - Columbus Holiday

7:15 AM – Meet in Walmart parking lot at the end near the Golden Coral, S. 6th street, Springfield (Leave at 7:30!)

9:30-10:15 - Frank Huelscher – private shop , 217-342-6838

Location: north edge of highway 32, a block from the Ford dealer. Private shop where owner (now retired) who constructed raised panel doors that he shipped all over the Midwest. He also constructed entire cabinets, miniature crosses, etc. Demonstration of “stretchable sandpaper applied to “turned” shapes and spun against mating edges on the doors and trim. He also invented a clamping jig similar to a Ferris wheel for gluing up the raised (or flat) panel doors. This site was on the original Effingham trip itinerary but had to be canceled because of Frank’s health problems two years ago.

1 mile SW of Altamont, big red barn with “Museum” painted on the roof is visible from I-70 618-483-6665.

Officially, the museum is permanently closed to the public but special tours can be arranged. Site includes a collection of farm equipment, steam and oil engines, etc. The mini steam and a gasoline train on 3,300 feet of track are no longer operated. They also have a 20 acre fruit and nut orchard, all with identification, that might be worth a visit.
