If you've read an interesting article or some other woodworking related source, bring the topic to one of our meetings to share. Your participation is needed.


And don't forget to call any members you haven't seen at our meetings lately to ask if they need a ride to our next one. Member attendance and participation is what keeps this club alive and interesting
