



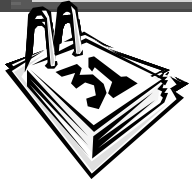

## October Field Trip Overview:

Date: Monday, October 14, 2014

Departure: Rochester Library Parking Lot

Time: 8:00 AM (Car Pool from there)

- **Effingham-Frank Huelscher's private shop:** Frank (retired) constructed raised panel doors that were shipped all over Midwest. Also constructed entire cabinets, miniature crosses, etc. Demonstration of "stretchable sandpaper" applied to turned shapes and spun against mating edges on the doors and trim.
- **Effingham-Niemerg's Steakhouse:** for an early lunch
- **Altamont-Ben Winter Museum (closed to the public):** Owners have agreed to allow us to tour their collection of farm equipment, steam and oil engines, a sophisticated private woodworking shop and a 20 acre mature, fully labeled, fruit and nut orchard.
- **Vandalia-Darrel Brown's private shop:** considered by some to be one of the best private woodworking shops in the area.
